

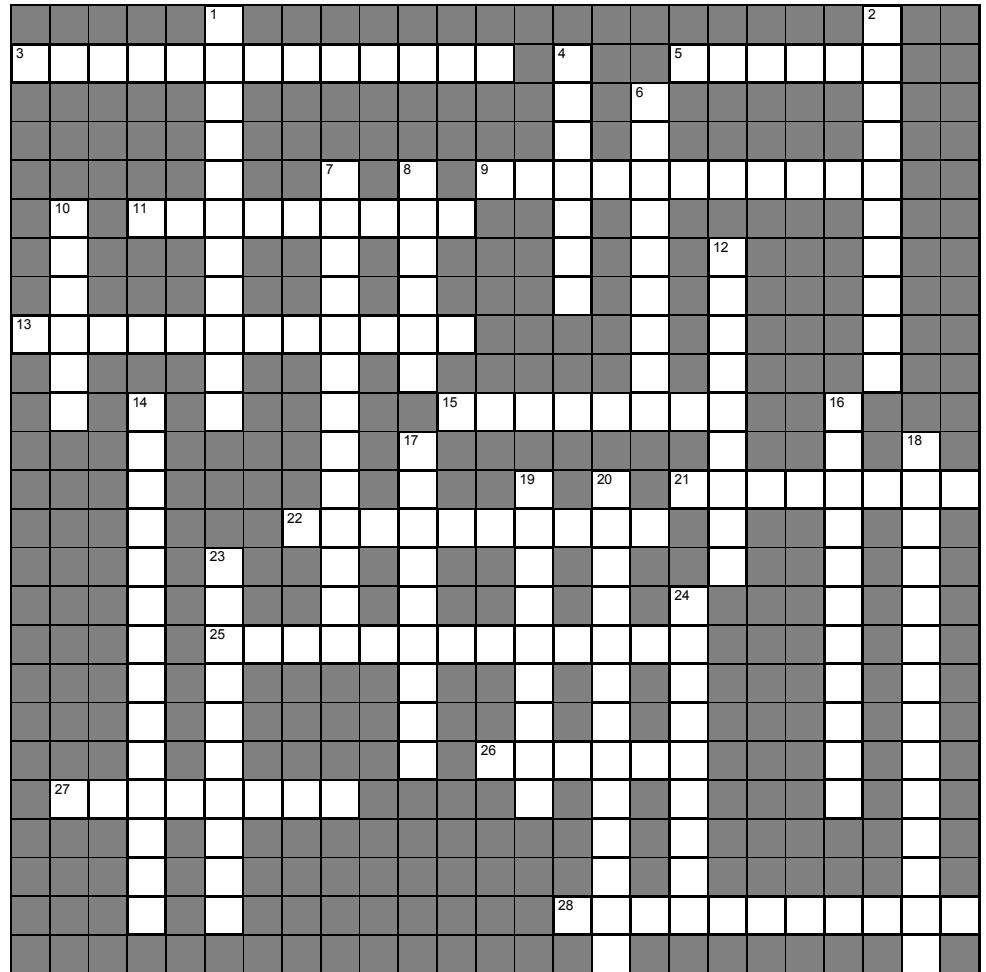

Lighthouses in the Western English Channel.

Across

- 3 North end of the Little Russell Channel. (6,7)
- 5 On island off west tip of Brittany also known as Le Stiff!
- 9 Island in approach to Lezardrieux. (3,2,6)
- 11 Major headland west of St Malo. (3,6)
- 13 Tip of Cherbourg peninsula. (3,2,2,5)
- 15 Main light on Jersey.
- 21 North of Channel Isles, has Traffic Separation Scheme named after it.
- 22 Rocks 10 miles offshore between Brehat and St Malo. (5,5)
- 25 Falmouth entrance. (2,7,4)
- 26 SW tip of Guernsey.
- 27 A rock said to be named after the howling the wind makes in rock fissures. (4,4)
- 28 Light ship on the reef where the tanker Torrey Canyon spilt her crude cargo. (5,6)



Down

- 1 7 island bird sanctuary off Perros Guirec. (3,4,4)
- 2 3 degrees 38.47 minutes west and shows red over the Skerries. (5,5)
- 4 Warns of the Runnelstone rocks west of Penzance. (5,2)
- 6 Tallest lighthouse in Europe. Near l'Aber Wrac'h. (3,6)
- 7 Entrance to St Malo. (2,5,6)
- 8 Marks the north

- entrance to the Chenal du Four. (2,4)
- 10 Most southerly point of mainland Britain.
- 12 On island near Roscoff. (3,2,4)
- 14 At the end of Chesil beach. (4,2,8)
- 16 North end of Scilly. (5,6)
- 17 Nothing to do with Vikings, a mile west of Lands End.
- 18 Southern end of Chenal du Four spelt in French, 'Point of Saint'... (3,2,2,7)
- 19 Devon headland with near vertical cliffs. On a clear day you can see Portland from it. (5,4)
- 20 Rocky island outcrop 16 miles off French coast SW of Guernsey. (6,7)
- 23 Famous trans Atlantic landfall light. (6,4)
- 24 Winstanley first, then Rudyerd, then Smeaton and now Douglass towers.
